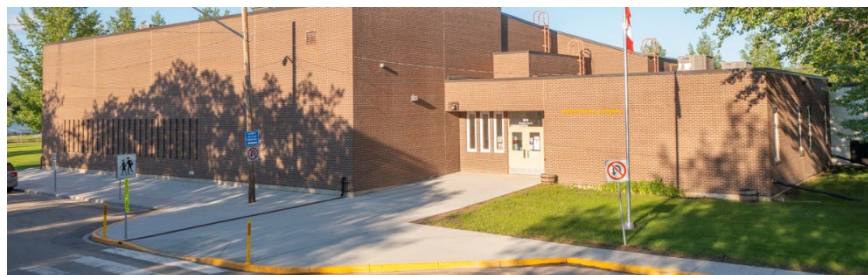

Pre-K Hours and Days of Operation:

Pre-K students attend school in the afternoon, Monday to Friday for 2 ½ hours each day from 1:00-3:30. It is the responsibility of the parent/ caregiver to arrange transportation for your child each day.

***DROP-OFF time:** PreK uses the east entrance of the school by the large playground structures. Please wait outside with your child. Your child can play on the equipment with the other children. I will greet you at the east door at 1pm. (Other students K to Grade 6 come in at 1:06pm when the bell rings) 😊

PICK UP time:** Pick up time is between 3:20pm and 3:30pm at the same east entrance. Parking is available on Brunswick Street **in front** of the school. **You are not permitted to park or pick up your child in the school parking lot. It is not SAFE!** Children can be picked up outside on the playground. This is our outside playtime (unless the weather permits us from doing so). *Please be aware that the bell to dismiss Kindergarten to Grade 6 rings at 3:25pm.**

***Please do not use the main front door for regular pick up and drop off. ***

It is important to build routines with your child. The front doors are locked and need to be accessed by buzzing the school administrative assistant.

For the safety of your children:

- 1) Please drop your child off at the Pre-K door across from the main office. You are welcome to come into the school, and our classroom with your child. When your child becomes more independent, you are encouraged to let them enter the school by themselves if they are able.
- 2) Please **DO NOT** use the staff parking lot for pick up and drop off.
- 3) If your child will be absent, late or if there are any changes in the pickup or drop off plan for your child, please phone the school, talk to one of our Pre-K team members at drop off, or send Mrs. AC a message on Edsby. If you need to contact us during class time, please phone the main office, as the Pre-K team is rarely able to access emails and messages during our busy class time.
- 4) Notify the school of **CHANGES** in phone #, address, or emergency contacts.



Please note: All doors, including our front doors will be locked after 1:06pm. If you arrive after this time, please come to the front/main door. You will need to buzz in at the camera, and Mrs. Lafond will let you in.

Family Days: (Mark your Calendar!)

Family Days are a highlight of Pre-K and are an important part of our overall program! Family activities are planned once a month. Please make arrangements to come for the morning WITH your child. You will enjoy fun and educational activities designed for the whole family. Let me know ideas of things you and your child would like to do and learn together.



What to bring: (Please label each item with your child's name)



School supplies are provided within the Pre-K program.

Your child will need to bring:

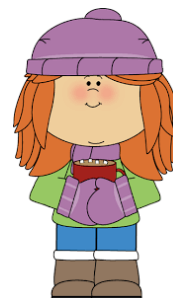
1 pair of Velcro running shoes to be kept at school

1 extra change of clothes to be kept at school (shirt, pants, underwear & socks.) Please put in a plastic bag with your child's name on it.

Backpack

Please do not send toys to school with your child. It is easy for them to get lost or broken within the classroom environment.

Outerwear: We spend a good amount of time outside daily. Thank you for sending your child dressed in proper outdoor clothing!



Snack: A healthy and filling snack is provided each day for Pre-K students, so there is no need to send food to school with your child. Please let us know of any food allergies or restrictions your child may have.

Pre-K Activities: Your child will be engaged in some of the following experiences during their morning at Pre-K:

Circle Time	<i>Stories, songs, fingerplays, & group learning activities.</i>
Play Time	<i>Children learn through play when they explore at a variety of centers, such as: blocks, dress-up, writing, science & nature, water & sand tables, play-dough, paint, puzzles, etc</i>
Art	<i>Children will be exploring and creating with a variety of media to express themselves.</i>
Small Group Activities	<i>Small groups of children work on activities such as sequencing, counting, matching, language activities, etc.</i>
Gym & Outdoor Play	<i>Children will develop gross motor skills, sensory awareness, and an appreciation for nature.</i>
Snack	<i>Children learn about nutrition, hygiene & manners.</i>

Speech and Language Assistance: All students entering Pre-Kindergarten complete a brief speech and hearing screen with our SLP. Parents will be notified of their child's results, and if necessary, students with speech and/or language difficulties may be referred for additional assistance in the classroom.



Instruction & Assessment: Our school division uses the Essential Learning Experiences from the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education to guide our planning. These include experiences to help each child develop in four key areas: Social Emotional, Physical, Spiritual, and Intellectual. Our program is concerned with the development of the whole child, and much of this development occurs through play and exploration.

Assessment refers to the way in which a teacher gathers information about what each child knows and can do. The teacher then uses this information to communicate progress with parents, and plan learning experiences according to each child's individual needs. I use an online tool called *Edsby* to communicate and capture the learning of students. I assess children's development of the Essential Learning Experiences, and it will be communicated to you through a very basic Pre-K report card twice a year. As well, all children who are 4 will be assessed using the EYE (Early Years Evaluation) to determine specific areas that may need focused support before Kindergarten.

Building Bridges/ Home Visits:

Building Bridges: An evening between October 14-16th, or 20th to 23rd. To be announced!

Home Visits: January 26th- January 29th, 2026, in the afternoon (NO SCHOOL this week)

Building Bridges: An evening between March 9th to 12th, or 16th to 19th. To be announced!

The purpose of the above visits is to engage with families about your child and how they are developing and growing in Pre-Kindergarten. This is also an opportunity to discuss what has been happening at school and some of the upcoming activities! You are always welcome to ask questions and make comments about your child's learning.

Learning Story: Our school division uses an online tool called *Edsby* to document your child's learning and progress. This is a great opportunity to see what your child is creating, exploring, and enjoying each day!

Classroom Behaviour: At school we teach positive behaviours that will encourage each child to treat our classroom and others with respect. We will guide and nurture every learner to grow in confidence as individuals, and as a member of our classroom community. At Brunswick School we will: *Be Safe. Be Kind. Be Responsible.*



It is our goal to work together with you to provide the best possible environment for your child to learn and grow. We are committed to providing a safe and happy classroom for both children and adults. By working together, your child will be better equipped to succeed! I look forward to a great year together!
