 - v. Date in middle of seeding for farm families most years, this year was ok due to the different weather this spring. How many people in Brunswick actually farm?
 - vi. Instructional minutes spent on track in gym over 2 weeks is only for the track meet, not from the curriculum. Some grades do only one gym class. It is important to families and community engagement.
 - Subcommittee of parents for the organizational items, parents form each classroom to get full representation. Ask wider group of parents.
 - vii. Getting feedback from some specific people request in homerooms, ask volunteer group leaders, while it is fresh. Find volunteers by having

- subcommittees that aren't the SCC to broaden the network of potential volunteers.
- viii. Last year feedback asked for date to be set and published earlier, but it did not result in more volunteers signing up earlier.
- ix. Parents using Edsby is essential to success. Check once a week if can't daily and won't miss anything. Calendar has events if don't see on the River (scrolling top menu)
